

## Community Disaster Relief Fund Disbursement Report

In response to the 2018 Carr Fire, the Community Disaster Relief Fund was activated by Shasta Regional Community Foundation. 100% of donated funds will be directed to Carr Fire recovery efforts, no fees will be assessed by the Community Foundation.

### Grants Distributed

Funds have been distributed from the Community Disaster Relief Fund in the form of grants to local nonprofits and government agencies. Requests were reviewed and approved by staff, a community grant review panel and approved by the Community Foundation Board of Directors. The following list reflects all distributions made to date:

### Donor Designated Grants

- \$6,000 Assist individuals in furnishing homes with locally purchased items via the Carr Furnishings project of Viva Downtown - 9/24/18
- \$4,500 Holiday gifts/activities for Carr Fire families – passes and activities to Rare Air, movie tickets, Shasta Caverns and other area attractions - 12/11/18

### Unrestricted Grants

- \$50,000 Provide utility deposits and rental assistance for individuals via the programs of Northern Valley Catholic Social Service, Inc. - 9/14/18
- \$80,000 Assist with erosion control of individual parcels via the work of Western Shasta Resource Conservation District - 10/19/18
- \$54,000 Assistance with case management via Northern Valley Catholic Social Service - 10/19/18
- \$70,000 Trail maintenance equipment: stand behind mini dozer and trailer to Redding Trail Alliance - 11/20/18
- \$10,000 Outreach support in the form of WalMart gift cards, Arco gas station gift cards, Shell gas station gift cards to Northern Valley Catholic Social Service/Cal HOPE Shasta - 12/11/18
- \$30,000 Individual survivor benefits: utility poles, Home Depot gift cards, gas cards to Salvation Army Redding - 12/11/18
- \$2,667 Replacement of materials destroyed in Carr Fire: fiction, nonfiction, DVDs and audio books for adults to Shasta Public Libraries - 12/11/18
- \$105,000 Individual survivor benefits: utility poles, septic systems, water lines, water tanks, gravel, soil and grading to Salvation Army Redding – 1/09/19
- \$200,000 Individual survivor benefits: installation and/or repair of utility poles, septic systems and lines, water lines, and gravel/soil and culvert replacement to Salvation Army Redding – 3/13/19

\$6,657	Shasta Builders’ Exchange (SBE) Community Fund to redesign and reprint the 3-Bedroom and 2-Bedroom house plans used by the CRT Construction Sub-Committee for the contractor-led rebuilds in Shasta County – 8/28/19
